Task 1:

The painting contains the words “Bürokratie”, “Femme”, “Rassismus”, “Hanau”, and “Orientalism”.

Here are short explanations of each word:

Bürokratie: The German word for “bureaucracy”. Bureaucracy is the way in which important processes take place in a country. In a bureaucracy, everything is precisely regulated and strictly ordered, and everyone has a clearly defined task. Regulations indicate how an action should be carried out.

Femme: The French word for “woman” (pronounced as “famm”) and the name of a Turkish café in Berlin.

Rassismus: The German word for “racism”. Racism is based on xenophobia and the degradation of people due to their origin or appearance. Racism can be manifested in harmful or insulting behavior towards people because of their skin color or culture.

Hanau: A city in Hesse, Germany, where a racist man killed several people in 2020 because of where they originally came from.

Orientalism: A term used to describe how people from European countries see cultures in the Near and Middle East, as well as in South Asia, for example in India, as being out of the norm. European cultures often come across as arrogant, as they use their own traditions as a standard that should be followed by the rest of the world.
